Pupil safeguarding is at the core of Portreath School and identifying opportunities for children to learn about safeguarding in the curriculum is key. Our broad and balanced curriculum allows pupils to develop their understanding of our diverse world and equip them with the skills and knowledge required for personal safeguarding.

We value pupils' questions and give them space to share their own thoughts, ideas, and concerns. We give them opportunities across the curriculum to explore values, rights, responsibilities, and equal opportunities. This enables our pupils to develop an understanding of moral concepts in a way that impacts positively on safeguarding, promotes British values, and prevents radicalisation and extremism.

Whole school assemblies also address safeguarding issues and safeguarding is covered through PSHE and Gooseberry Planet (online safety).

As part of the curriculum, Y2 and Y6 will be taking part in workshops about healthy relationships run by Barnardo's. Y2 and Y6 parents should have received a letter about this that contained a link to a zoom session for parents that will take place on Monday 7th November at 5.30pm if you want to find out more.


