This week we had our first governors' meeting for the year. It was good to reflect on last year but also to share our priorities for this year. I am sad to announce that Graham May has stepped down as a governor. Therefore, we will be looking for a new community governor and a new parent governor. We will send out further information about the parent governor role soon, if you are interested in this role. On behalf of the staff and governors, I would like to say a huge thank-you to Graham for all his support and involvement over the last few years.

This year we are part of the 'United Against Bullying' national programme. I attended a webinar this week which gave the national perspective as well as strategies for dealing with bullying. I was shocked to hear that 41% of children in primary and secondary schools surveyed by UAB reported that they had been bullied. The children in Cherry and Oak have completed surveys and we will talk to the younger children about bullying to help us understand our current situation and things we could do to help. We have decided to join this programme, not because we feel we have an issue with bullying, but because we are aware that bullying happens in every school and we want to ensure we are doing all we can to prevent it and support children involved. As a school we feel it is important to support the target of any bullying but also support and work with the child bullying to prevent them repeating the behaviour. One of the things that I shared with the children this week is the power of words, which links in with our 'Culture of the Heart' work. We also explored the idea that once words are said they are hard to take back-ask them about the toothpaste assembly!

Today Evelyn and Ellie went to King Edward Mine, as members of the Crofty Trust Pupil Council. This was linked to the environmental work that the council are working on, as well as learning about local culture. As a school, we are environmentally aware and we are delighted that schools across the trust, like us, are trying to improve how we operate to reduce our negative impact on the environment.

A big thank-you to the fighfighters who came in today to meet with Maple Class. They loved exploring the fire engine!
