I am thrilled that we have been awarded the Primary Science Quality Mark this week. A huge well done to Mrs Jones who leads science at our school. She completed training, an audit and then wrote and carried out an action plan linked to science across the school. Well done to her and all the team for making the teaching of science even better at Portreath. We hope we are creating future scientists!

I am the English leader for the school and we are currently focused on improving the teaching of writing across the school because overall our children (like most children across UK) attain higher in reading and maths compared to writing. Just before half term Lucie Clarke and myself attended a course called 'The Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar.' You might hear the children talking about Grammarsaurus. This is a resource which helps the children to secure the basics and understand the structure of our language. I will be sharing more information about this over the coming months. As well as them being able to punctuate their grammatically correct sentences, we want them to be creative, enthusiastic writers. We give the children opportunities to write in a variety of genres often linked to our learning in other subjects. This week I had the pleasure of observing 'Drawing Club' in Maple Class. This is an approach that encourages children to write. It was wonderful to see the enthusiasm of the staff, as well as the children, for it. The children were full of creative ideas and could not wait to put pencil to paper! I observed a fabulous writing session in Oak Class. They were writing a character description of Beowulf. I was so impressed with their ambitious word choices and their enthusiasm to paint a picture with words. Today I observed an excelent writing session in Sycamore Class. They were writing descriptions linked to Greek mythical creatures. Miss Tonkin expertly modelled writing about her own creature and then the children started writing their own brilliant character descriptions. Next week I am looking forward to getting into Rowan and Cherry Class.

Cherry Class got to meet a celebrity this week! Miss Clarke and Mrs Doble certainly loved meeting Darcey Bussell and the children loved their dance workshop with her. Another amazing opportunity for our children to celebrate and engage with the arts.


