This week we enjoyed getting outside and going on a minibeast hunt as part of our Science learning. We loved exploring different areas and discovering different creatures in their microhabitats. We have created our own stories set in The Amazon Rainforest and have started writing them this week. In Geography, we learned about the impacts of deforestation.

In Science this week we conducted an experiment based on evaporation. We had to predict which conditions were best for drying washing. We found that in the current weather conditions the best place was on our classroom radiator! In English we have continued to read and enjoy our class book, Tamarind and the Star of Ishta. From this we have been planning letters as the main character Tamarind to her friend Rafi.
