This week we have been adding the finishing touches to our non-chronological reports about animals in the Amazon rainforest, before starting our new unit about writing an ocean setting description. We developed our art skills with colour wheels and mark-making using different brushes and in RE we used pastels to create pieces of work linked to the events of the Easter story. We also set up our science investigation where we are exploring what conditions plants will survive in.



Oak Class



It's been a busy week in Oak! The trip on Tuesday was a real highlight and we were beyond proud of all Oak for their enthusiasm and lovely company! They really enjoyed painting the Monet-style bridge and seeing the Koi carp. From this trip, we have been writing a recount - remembering all the experiences we had. In science, the children looked at the difference between melting and dissolving materials and made predictions, before testing out their theories.











This week we have started our new science topic which is all about healthy lifestyles. We are working in research groups to investigate different aspects of what enables us to keep healthy; the aim is then to create a mini film to present to the rest of the class. On Wednesday we enjoyed exploring more of the Culture of the Heart emotions cards together.
