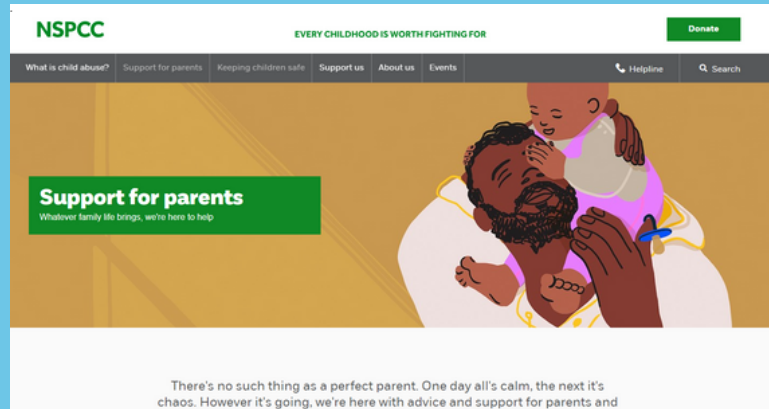

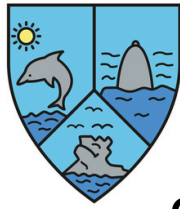


Sycamore Class

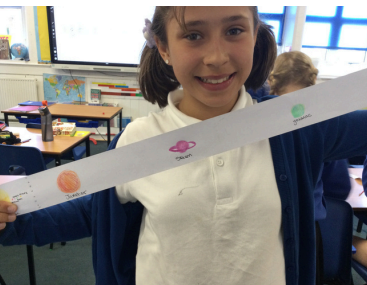
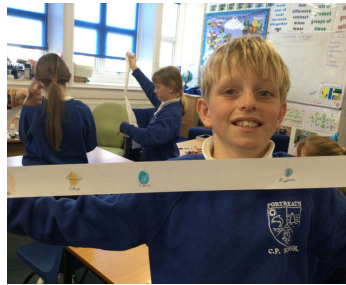
Oak Class

We also learnt that poor old Pluto has been downgraded and is no longer classified as a planet! Meanwhile, in English, we started to prepare for our debate around whether space exploration should be supported or discontinued.

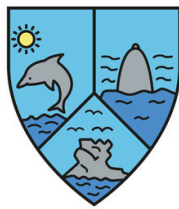
