


This week we continued our learning on Cornwall, mining and Humphry Davy. We enjoyed learning all about Humphry Davy's life and his achievements when he was alive. We were also fascinated to take a look at a real-life Davy lamp brought in by Harvey! We have also been learning about the three types of skeletons in science and some examples of animals with endoskeletons, exoskeletons and hydrostatic skeletons. In art we explored the idea of proportion by creating some self-portraits.















We had a fantastic start to the week – we were kindly leant Isla Eldred's family tree, that her family have been working on. It spanned back 57 generations and showed lineage from the Saxons and Vikings! Thank you so much to the Eldred family for letting us take a look at this! We have been really getting creative with setting descriptions, based on our book 'Why the Whales Came'. Many of the descriptions really captured the eerie atmosphere of the island of Bryher. In Science, we compared the size of the planets to different foods; Mercury would be the size of a peppercorn and Saturn a watermelon! We then measured the distance of each planet to the sun - we had to do this down the corridor, as it was a rainy day outside! Finally, in geography, we have been learning about longitude and latitude lines.
