Portreath

Primary School

On Tuesday Mrs Kerslake took our 2 Crofty Trust Parliament members, Martha and Reuben, to their first meeting at the Crofty's offices in Tolvaddon. Each of the 16 schools had 2 representatives who came together to discuss ways to making Crofty schools even better. They all came up with lots of ideas and then had to vote on their favourites. Two ideas Reuben and Martha liked were having more sporting events for all the schools and more opportunities for the schools to meet up. They both felt very proud to represent Portreath School.

This week in assembly, I told the children the story 'The Emperor's New Clothes'. Throughout the year I like to include some traditional stories and stories from other cultures in assemblies and in our English curriculum. I think it is important for children to know fairytales because many things use them as reference points. Often, we assume children know these stories but don't. If you don't have a book of traditional stories and fairytales at home, I would urge you to invest in one. I also think it is important to tell stories without pictures for them to look at, so they get good at creating pictures in their mind. I often say to them 'turn the TV on in your head.' I encourage you all to read and tell your children stories so that they develop a wonderful imagination. Stories also help us develop empathy, vocabulary and understanding.

As well as reading to your child, it is important that they read themselves regularly. Ideally, they should read every day at home, but if that is tricky for you, they need to be reading at least 4 times a week. We teach them to read in school, but it is essential that they practise at home too. This does not have to be in the evenings, it can be a great breakfast time routine. It is about finding a time that is best for your child. For the younger children just 5 -10 minutes of reading to an adult every day makes such a difference. Older children can often manage a bit longer and read to themselves. We have noticed that some parents are not logging their child's reading on the app Boomreader. If you have any issues with the app, please pop in to see your child's teacher. Congratulations to Mimi and Ella who both achieved their special certificates for reading all the Y1 recommended reads. Thanks to all parents and carers for all your support with reading.
