What a busy sporting week. Starting with sports day. Thank you to all the families who came along to support. It was great to see all the children joining in and having a great time.

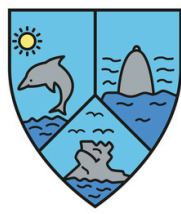

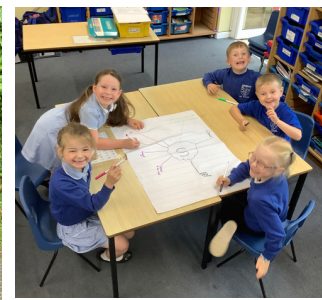

Maple Class

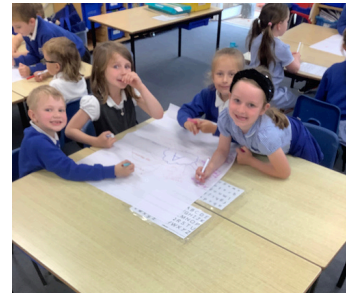

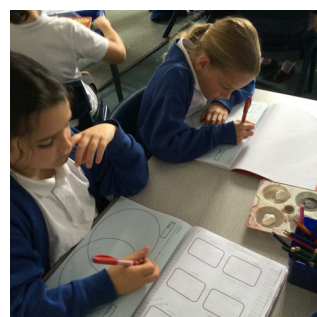


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Birch Class

Hazel Class



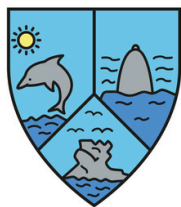
