This week we were excited to welcome the children who will be in Reception in September into school for their first transition session. Mrs Forsdick had already met them during their home visits but this was their chance to see the classroom and each other. They had a wonderful time and all engaged well with playing. We can't wait to see them again next week!

This week we received the results to the Year 4 multiplication test and were delighted. The test is out of 25 and the average score for our children was 22! The children worked so hard to achieve this and I am proud of them all. Knowing your times tables off by heart really helps build confidence and fluency in maths and is a skill you use in everyday life. We have also received the pass mark for our Year 1 phonic screening and 96% passed this screening which is incredible! This shows that our children are confident and fluent with their reading. More importantly our Year Ones, like the rest of our children, love to read! Thanks to all the parents and carers for their support with reading at home.

This week Hazel were lucky enough to visit The Tate and Barbara Hepworth Museum in St Ives. They had a fantastic time! As well as exploring the art, they got to create some too. Sycamore Class had a brilliant time at Eden, and took part in a fabulous workshop. Thanks to the group of Year 6 children who helped out on the trip. All the children got to take part in the 'Go Active' morning on Wednesday and did activities such as archery. Thanks to Mrs Seary for organising this exciting morning.

This week Lizzie Young, an autism specialist, led some training at our staff meeting. We focused on strategies and routines that can support neurodivergent children in school. It was really interesting and helpful. We were pleased that many of the things suggested we already do, but she also had some great extra ideas for us to try out.
