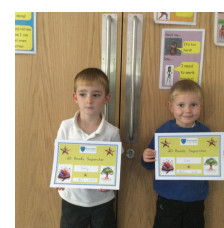

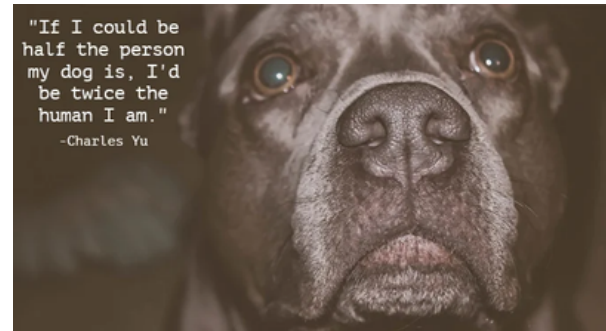

Also, this week Birch and Hazel had a rugby session with Cornish Pirates.

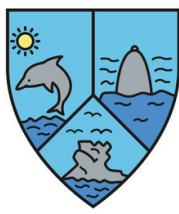
They played lots of fun games and learned some rugby skills.

Hazel Class



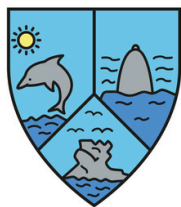

Cornish spelling:

Penn, skoodh ha glin, bys troos, glin, bys troos / x2 / Ha lagas, skovarn, gowarn ha tron / Penn, skoodh ha glin, bys troos, glin, bys troos!

Translation:

Penn / Head | Skoodh / Shoulder | Ha / And | Glin / Knee | Bys troos / Toe

Lagas / Eye | Skovarn / Ear | Gowarn / Mouth | Tron / Nose
