#### Safeguarding and Health and Safety

Pokémon GO has been among the world's most popular mobile games since its spectacular release in 2016. It enjoyed a more recent resurgence, thanks partly to people combining entertainment and exercise during lockdown in the early months of the Covid pandemic. In Pokémon GO – like the Pokémon TV show, trading card series and other video games – players capture, train and battle with their Pokémon creatures: physically exploring locations while using augmented reality via their phone's screen.

The game generally provides a positive experience, but there are still some safety concerns to consider.

We have had a great week in Rowan Class. We are loving our new history topic all about Mary Anning – this week, we created a timeline of Mary's life. We have also been using Mary Anning as inspiration in English, where we wrote some fantastic diary entries in character, about the day when Mary discovered her first dinosaur fossil. In RE, we were learning about baby Jesus and why Christians believe he was special. We enjoyed positive noticing day and wrote some wonderful words about our classmates on our labels before wearing them all day and showing them off. Finally. We have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes in Maths. What a jam-packed week!



# Sycamore Class













We have had great fun in Sycamore Class this week! We are really enjoying our Topic learning on the Great Fire of London and in Art we've been making paper collages to reflect the changing colours of fire. In English, we've written independent instructions on how to wash our hands properly and we've now moved onto learning about diary entries, again focused on the Great Fire of London. We've been reading 'The Butterfly Lion' as a class and in Mathematics, we have now begun our new unit on shapes! ## **Birch Class**











The highlight of the week was our trip to The Regal Theatre to see 'Grandma on the Moon' performed by the AZ2B Theatre Company. We really enjoyed the thoughtful performance and posed some very good questions during the Q&A session. It was a pleasure to take them. We started our history unit with a very insightful lesson on the timeline of Stone Age to Iron Age. We placed the main events on the timeline and discovered very little is known about the Stone Age because there was no written language. In English, we have been collected tinder, twigs and logs before creating a fire- just like real Stone Age people. In science, we have been busying making predictions if electrical circuit would light up a build. Finally, the week concluded with our final swimming session.



# **Hazel Class**













This week in science we learnt about circuits. The children had the task to fix a broken circuit, which a pet rabbit had nibbled through, using a range of materials. The children had to predict the materials that would conduct electricity and then test them. It was really fun on English we have started our next unit where we will write an innovation to the story of Aladdin. We have used our oracy skills to tell our own tales to each other in class. We thoroughly enjoyed writing positive affirmations about each other in class and proudly displayed our own personal ones, on tags.

# **Cherry Class**











On Monday we started our new science topic on electricity by having some "tinker time" where we experimented and reminded ourselves of learning in previous year groups. We also learnt about Michael Faraday "The Father of Electricity" and were surprised to find he had a Cornish connection: he was an apprentice to the chemist Humphry Davy. In English, we have enjoyed the start of our new unit of work on writing newspaper reports. In history we learnt about the impact of the industrial revolution and some of the inventions which came about during the Victorian era.
