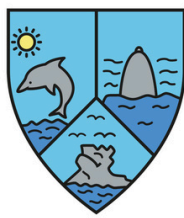

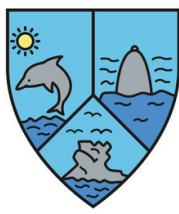
PE News

In Rowan and Sycamore the children have been playing team games, talking about how to be a team player and using good communication skills.

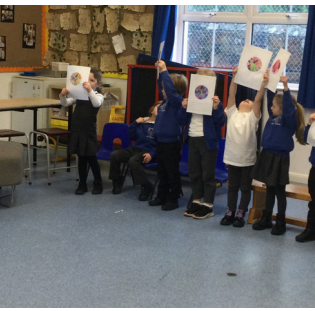
In Birch, the children worked on passing skills, using a range a netball passes.





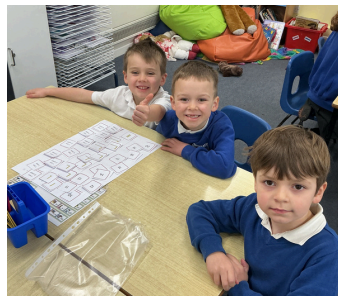
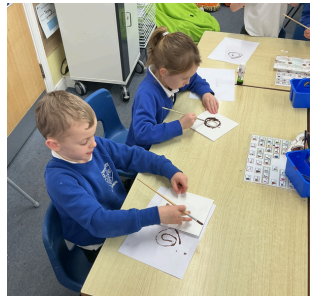

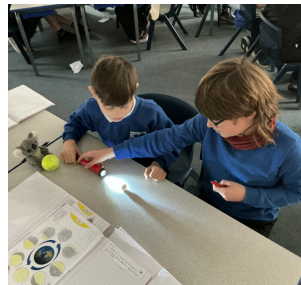
Birch Class

Hazel Class



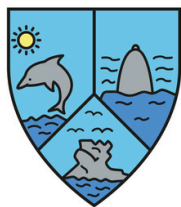

We have also explored maps in geography, locating Mount Olympus and thinking about the crops grown in the country. We have begun to create our own leaflets about Greece, using our plans and research.
