We've had a super first week in Rowan Class. We have launched our new topics, including our geography topic about the weather and our science all about the four seasons. We focused on Winter and made our own crystals and snow. In English, we've been planning setting descriptions of the forest in different seasons in preparation to write them next week. In Maths, we have started our unit on multiplication and division by learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

What a wonderful first week back! We are really enjoying our new geography learning focusing on Kenya and have been busy learning about what life is like there. In Maths, we have been learning about temperature and measuring in litres and next week we will begin our new topic on fractions. In our writing lessons we have been looking at a range of different fables (including some based in Kenya) to identify the key features they contain including animals as characters and finding the moral of each short story. In computing this half term, we will be focusing on photography and in science we have been looking at labelling the different parts of plants and flowers.

One of the highlights of the week has been our computing lesson where we have been learning to create computing coding to make a 'sprite' move across the screen. We have many future app designers in our class. In music this week, we listened and discussed 'Blackbird' by The Beatles. We were curious about the lyrics so undertook some research and we discovered that it was written to capture the struggle of black Americans in the 1960s and 1970s. It's been a fantastic first week back and the children have made a brilliant start to the term. We were lucky enough to participate in a LIVE lesson from the Eden Project 'One Big Rainforest Do', we reactivated our previous learning about Rainforests and then through discussion thought about ways we can give back to our community, which ties in beautifully with Christianity this half term. We have launched our new topic on rivers, which has already inspired some lovely learning across the curriculum. In English, the children wrote their own free verse poems about a river, using vivid imagery and descriptive language. In Geography, we explored what a river is and began to understand its key features, while in science we learnt about where rain comes from as part of the water cycle. Tying in with this, we had the wonderful Nataliia in creating river masterpieces using pastels. In DT, we have started designing our own moving pictures—of course, with a river theme. It's been a great start, and we're looking forward to building on this learning in the coming weeks.

We have had a very busy first week of term! Our history unit for this half term ties in with our residential to Bristol by looking at the life and legacy of Isambard Kingdom Brunel; as part of our first session some of us dressed up to look like the great engineer himself! In science we started off our new topic by getting stuck into a practical session all about the circulatory system – did you know that your heart is approximately the same size as your clenched fist?

Cherry Class



What a great first week back. The children have enjoyed getting started with their new PE topics. Maple, Rowan and Sycamore have started with their balls and rackets unit. Birch, Hazel and Cherry have started with Tennis and Communication and Tactics Units.

In Rowan class they started using a range of balls and rackets to move them around the playground avoiding the cones and keeping control. In Hazel and Birch, the children started with a game of human noughts and crosses, where one child from each group leads their team to play, then they practiced their forehand serve and finished with mini games. In Cherry class we started with some mini noughts and crosses games then moved on to human noughts and crosses. Then played some code games, seeing which team could crack the code. In Maple the children enjoyed using balloons to practice their skills using their hand to bat the balloon and keep it off the floor, we then played mini games with a partner. The children finished the lesson with some mini balloon tennis games.
