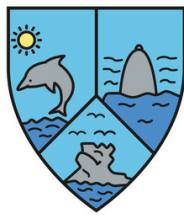

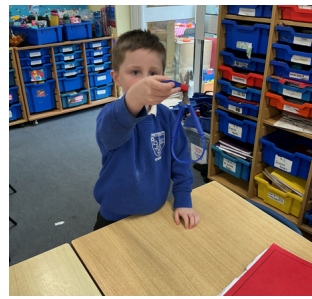
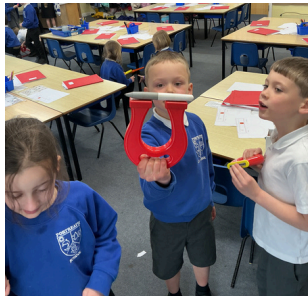


Portreath Primary School Maple Class

Sycamore Class

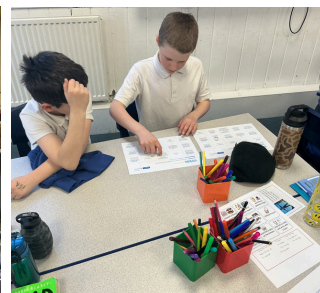

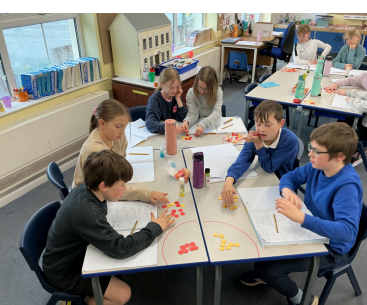
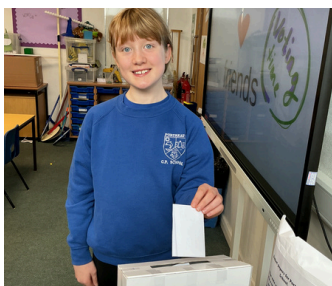
Birch Class

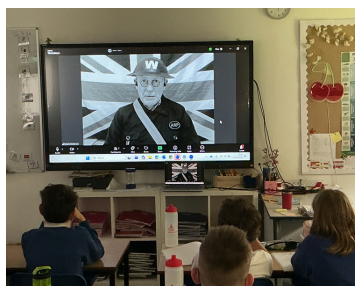
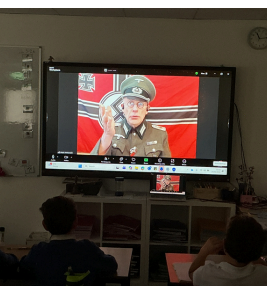


Hazel Class

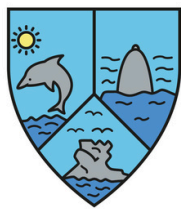

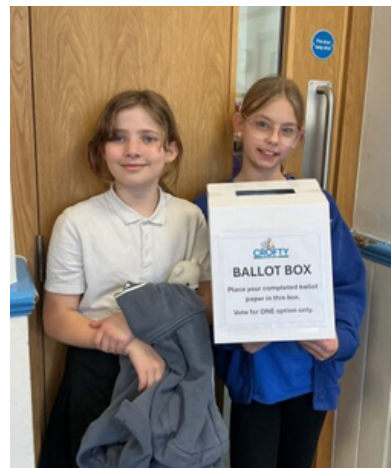
