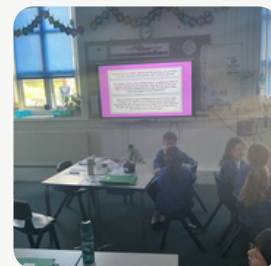

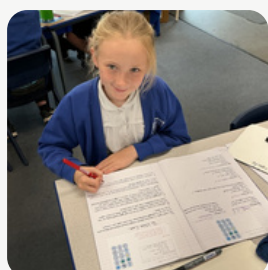

Hazel Class



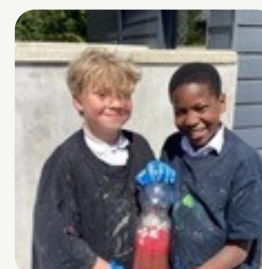
